APPENDIX B TEXTBOOKS

The supplemental allocation for the purchase of core adoption textbooks will be funded on a pro rata basis of each system's FY 2025 ADM. The amount allocated to each LEA is attached to this Appendix.

Funds will be automatically disbursed prior to the start of the school year. Fund source 1772 should be used to account for the revenue and expenditures associated with these funds. All funds should be expended by **September 30, 2026.**

These funds are allowed to be used in the same manner as traditional textbook funds appropriated annually as part of the Foundation Program allocation. Appropriate FY 2025 expenditures previously paid from other sources can be reclassified to this fund source.
